Should they really be taken at face value? Does that mean I can sin 355 days a year as long as I cry for the 10 days of Muharram?




OR does it mean Islam is like Christianity, where Salvation is through a person?



The CEREBELLUM is a single part of the brain, just like these hadiths are only a part of Islam.

By itself it CANNOT function, just like we need all the parts in order to reach PERFECTION!



A Brain without a cerebellum = an uncoordinated and sluggish person.

a religion based on only fragments = imperfection ≠ true Islam.

Let's delve deeper into these ahadith so that we can come to an understanding about them.

So why did the prophet (SWAT) refer to Ahl al-bayt as Noah's Ark?

There are three key points to Noah's story (as found in the Quran)

Noah's warning of the great flood SIGNS

Family

Nuh needs to bring with him both family & believers upon the Ark.

Believers

While people called Noah a liar, once the signs/warnings became a reality, people ceased to call Noah a liar, yet they still refused to believe. This is best demonstrated through the quran's reference to Nuh's son, who knew the truth but was too arrogant to admit it.

The heart is IN CONTROL

→ While you can't change what your brain perceives, your heart is what decides which path you take, be it belief or ignorance.

The requirement of bringing in a pair of each animal to the ark.

Nuh had to think beyond those immediately around him. Allah ordered him to take responsibility and ensure that life (of the animals) is sustained.

→ We too need to be responsible for the world around us, whether for the environment, for animals, for people who are in dire needs, for that was part of Ahl Al-bayt's work and role on earth. If we want to follow them we must do the same.



Every Mu'min, whose eyes shed tears upon the killing of Husayn ibn Ali (A.S) ... Allah shall accommodate him in the elevated rooms of paradise. Tanaabe 'al-Manaddah, pg. 419.

In the end Allah tells Nuh that his son is not his 'family'. So belief brings us together as a 'family' closer than biological ties. As muslims are we acting on protecting this family?





Similarly, if I gave the lollipop to an adult woman, will she be content? No! as we all would do, she will request to swap with the child in order to get the cheque.



BUT GOD did NOT punish him???

↳ Because this man was isolated = limited access to knowledge

↳ he tried his best to worship his lord despite the imperfections in his belief.

But, God, why then did you give me so much intellectual capacity? Doesn't that mean I have to work harder?
NOT FAIR!!

Similarly: The greatest reward for a muslim is *jilz* where god is happy and satisfied with our efforts, yet many of us prefer a more tangible reward in heaven. But InshaAllah we will one day reach a stage where this reward = satisfaction

The more Knowledge and intellectual capacity, the more we are able to fathom the reasons and rewards that Allah gives us.

THE MORE ACCOUNTABILITY then naturally the REWARD WILL BE GREATER

TWO ELEMENTS.



THIRD ELEMENT

LANGUAGE

If you don't have a proper grasp on the ambiguities and subtle differences, the religious and linguistic definitions of the language and words, misunderstandings/misinterpretations will ensue!



The man must be KAFIR!

Even within the scholarly community there is a lot of confusion



Not really! you can choose to not pray and yet believe, that type of kufur is different from كافر.

Someone who sins is a كافر or a person who carries out an injustice as you are doing an injustice to yourself.

You deserve BETTER

الذين عاصوا ولهم يابسوا
أولئك لهم عذاب أليم
الآمنون وهم مهتدون

Those who believe and do not mix up their faith with iniquity, those are they who shall have the security and they are who go alright.

surat Al-Anaam: 22.

If we were to define a "Believer in GOD", then... Even shaytan would go to heaven!
That makes NO SENSE.
Rather a believer is one who does NO

→ Inequity
→ Injustice

Now we know what constitutes a Mu'min, BUT...

What makes a KAFIR?

IMAM AL-SADIQ (A.S) says.

1. كفود The one who denies something he believes is true.

→ denies existence of God

2. كفروا از الـ بـ كـ فـ رـ وـ اـ زـ

عـ اـ زـ وـ كـ فـ رـ وـ اـ زـ

These people deny the bounties and blessings to them whether you warn of God or do not warn them, or do not believe of desire.

Surat Al-Baqara: 16.

Denial of HAQ (that of which they have certainty)

Results in tension between



Examples are the Jews in the time of the prophet.

They had all the signs indicating the coming of Rasulullah Muhammad, yet though they recognised him, they refused to acknowledge his prophethood because he was not from bani-israel.

4. DISREGARDING ALLAH'S COMMANDS

وَلَا تُنْهِي عَنِ الْكَنَّا

surat At-baqra: 15. "Do you then believe in a part of the Book and disbelieve in the other?"

وَلَا تُنْهِي عَنِ الْكَنَّا

surat Ibrahim: 7 "And when your Lord made it known if you are grateful, I would certainly give to you more, and if you are ungrateful, My chastisement is truly SEVERE"

There are 5 different religious perspectives of the word 'كفر' in the Quran.



3. UNGRATEFULNESS

وَلَا تُنْهِي عَنِ الْكَنَّا

Those who deny what they know is true.



→ Relevant to our topic

Out of 2 billion Muslims, most are sunni, yet we say that those who die without knowing and acknowledging Imam Al-mehdi die an IGNORANT DEATH.... Does that mean most people are kafir? (muslims)



"My Ummah will be divided into 73 sects - from the 73, the prophet (SWAT) said: 13 will be called Shia. HOWEVER 12 of them will go to HELLFIRE"

I don't think prophet said this... it is disuniting

But, then, you can say that about the Quran as well, if you selectively interpret an Aya. In fact it is more likely that the Prophet has said this (due to the hadith being part of the books of every muslim school of thought).



Imam Ali (A.S.) "The Shia (Twelvers) who go to heaven aren't accepted only based on their belief, but rather on the basis that they lived a life that is beyond / doesn't need to be held accountable for."



But what about those who believe in you but... you know... they don't exactly follow you... They are sincere, they do the wajibat, but occasionally sin...
You are not their enemy, they still love you

The other 72 are worshippers of the devil

They are NOT even counted as part of the 73. Rather outside those 73 are those who...

- If they know we are Ahl al-Bayt, they must at least love us. They don't need to accept us or our Imams.

- Don't go against Allah and follow his commands
- Do not follow their / live by their desires RATHER, Allah will let them straight through to HEAVEN



1. Action vs intention → are actions based on our level of submission?
YES. Take Prophet Ibrahim → had to sacrifice his son. As he began to
take that action Allah replaced his son with a sheep. Therefore he
was rewarded before the action was committed. → It is about his willingness & submission.



Yes, you need to think, search and be

3. Does god want it?

e.g. Prayers.

But what is an EVIDENCE? Parents or are we intellectually convinced by
RESEARCH ~ You must determine what
evidence convinces you because the
ONUS of belief lies upon
YOUR SHOULDERS.



This is REALITY

As god sees it

3. Do Our actions have to be REFLECTIVE OF REALITY?

Now I am fully certain that this is a bottle of water, and we know for certain that it is actually water. So if I drink from this bottle would I commit a sin?

No, I might even gain hazzanat.

Put it this way. What if you ate something thinking it was halal and it turned out that it contained gelatine?

If we are judged by the reality of things then I have drunk alcohol and committed a sin.

If we are judged by the extent of our submission and obedience to Allah then am I still committing a sin?

What if the situation was reversed? What if I drank the water while thinking (with certainty) that it is alcohol? Am I sinning? YES!

So Allah judges us by our level of submission.

إِنَّمَا يُحِبُّ اللَّهُ الْمُتَّقِينَ

Whoever strives and arrives with correct evidences he will get 2 rewards if he is correct. If he gets it incorrect but still uses valid evidences he still gets 1 reward.

VS

فَمَنْ يَعْمَلْ مِثْقَالَ ذَرَّةٍ بِغَيْرِ إِيمَانٍ

Whoever interprets the Quran through his own opinion and gets it right, he doesn't get rewarded for it. (Some narrations say that he will still be punished). If he gets it incorrect he is even further away from the heavens and the earth.

I meaning he is so far away from heaven that is close to HELL.

1. used correct method
2. got it correct.

Here there are many narrations saying that the way that we strive to attain the reality is MORE important than the reality itself.

If it is based on reality - then he will be punished and rewarded. BUT if it is based on our submission & intention, perhaps his reward is higher than mine.

Now, let's say the reality is WIPPING the feet - will the person washing their feet be punished or rewarded? Is his salat accepted?



Hussaini Rituals

In the same way, there are many Hussaini rituals, including ones that you may not necessarily agree with. But just because you aren't convinced does that give you the right to criticize and belittle the love others have for Hussain (A.S.)? **NO!** They too are

convinced of a 'reality' and strive towards ultimate submission & obedience to Allah through their actions.

NO THERE IS ONLY **1 REALITY**. **BUT WAIT!** Does that mean that everyone in the whole world is correct? Is there multiple realities?

But that does not mean Allah judges based upon that reality. He judges each individual based upon that person's UNDERSTANDING of the reality → It must include your certainty in the evidence you have + your level of submission.

WUDHU In particular the part of the feet.

So, I wipe my feet. my evidence for this is that the Imams of Ahl al-Bayt said "you wipe it". I maybe can use an aya in the Quran to prove this point as well.

How about other schools of thought? Some of them WASH it.

Their evidence says: the sahaba washed their feet (in wudhu).

Now, let's say the reality is WIPPING the feet - will the person washing their feet be punished or rewarded? Is his salat accepted?



So in this whole equation where does Shafaa (for Lewis) fit in?



Know they are of the believers.

eg. Those who fought with imam Hussain died with a smile on their faces, satisfied with completing their mission.



Is this true?

YES, because everytime it was said it had its own context.

→ TRUE because the sacrifice of saying "Wl xl xl x" was your life!

What was important were not the words in fact the first shaheed of Islam not the actions. SUMAYA - was killed because of insistence to say these words.

TRUE → because at that time HYPOCRISY was strife and therefore saying "Wl xl xl x" in MEDINA with SINCERITY would guarantee you heaven.

→ true. But now the condition is not just sincerity and belief. rather you must also believe in the Imamat, because that belief could cost your life = sacrifice.

EVERYTHING HAS IT'S OWN CONTEXT:

The best ziyarah is the one of my father, Imam Al-ridha (AS)

But, oh Imam, they say that the best ziyarah is that of Imam Hussain. Which is better? whom shall I read?

Imam Al-jawad

Imam Al-Hussain is blessed with many reciting his ziyarah, but my poor father has very few.

Al-MAJLISI
For every period/time a different Imam needs our ziyarat.

So Today, in this day & age, WHO IS BEING NEGLECTED?

BUT, SAYIDAH MED, can you find me a narration telling us to visit these imams?



We shouldn't be striving for this, we should strive to be the best of mu'mineen.



Now we often wonder why the boat of salvation for Imam Hussain is bigger than other Imams.

This is because of the principals and morals behind

his story. Other imams were killed by individuals while Imam Hussain was cornered and killed by an Ummah.

HOW CAN WE UTILISE THE PRINCIPLES AND MORALS LEFT BY OUR IMAM IN A WAY THAT REVIVES HIS MESSAGE TODAY?

]- So here, the CONTEXT defines that this hadith stands true for when Tears for Hussain = Death or great sacrifice.

Take for example our Malaysian brothers & sisters. → just for honouring muharram 23 were arrested.

So can the price of our tears be compared to the price back then? or to the price paid by those who shed them elsewhere?

understanding the context of these things is vital to understanding them.

In the time where this hadith was said, even mentioning the name of Imam Al-Hussain could lead to death as you are distancing yourself (doing barakah) from the rulers and oppressors of that time.

No Narration is needed! There was no need for people to be instructed on ziyarat at that time

But now, Imam Hussain (AS) has followers from all around the world. Don't the other Imam's deserve love from us? surely the reward for visiting and honouring these Imams is greater in our current times?

What is the BIGGEST SACRIFICE we are making today?

It is wearing the HIJAB.

because the
hardest thing in
